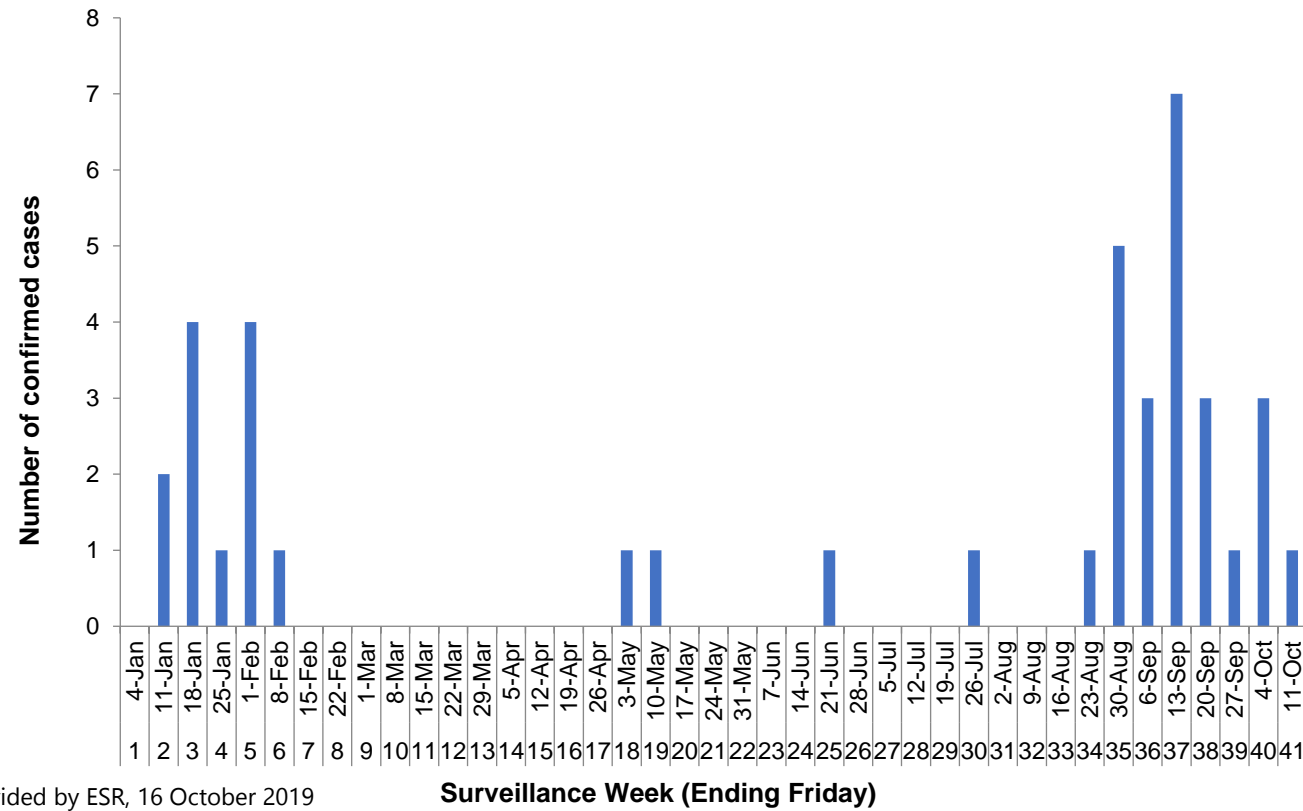


National Measles Outbreak: Waikato District Health Board – accurate as of 16 October 2019

All cases linked to Auckland cases

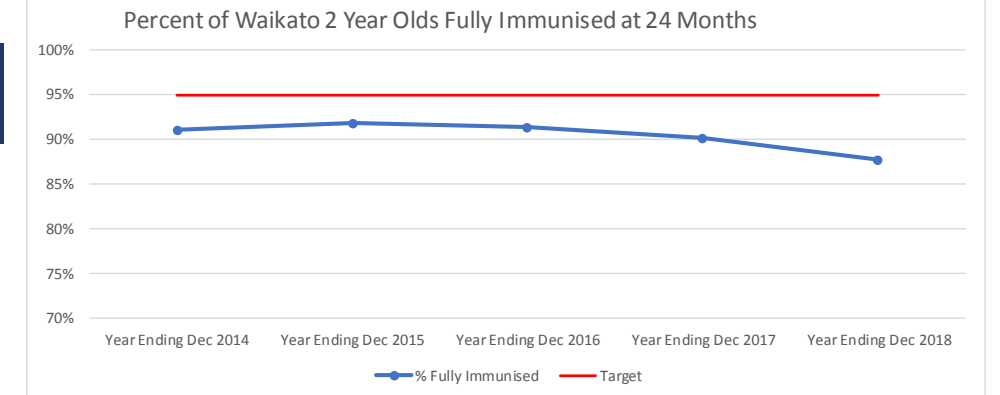
The number of measles cases in Waikato

- 10** Cases of measles reported in the past two weeks

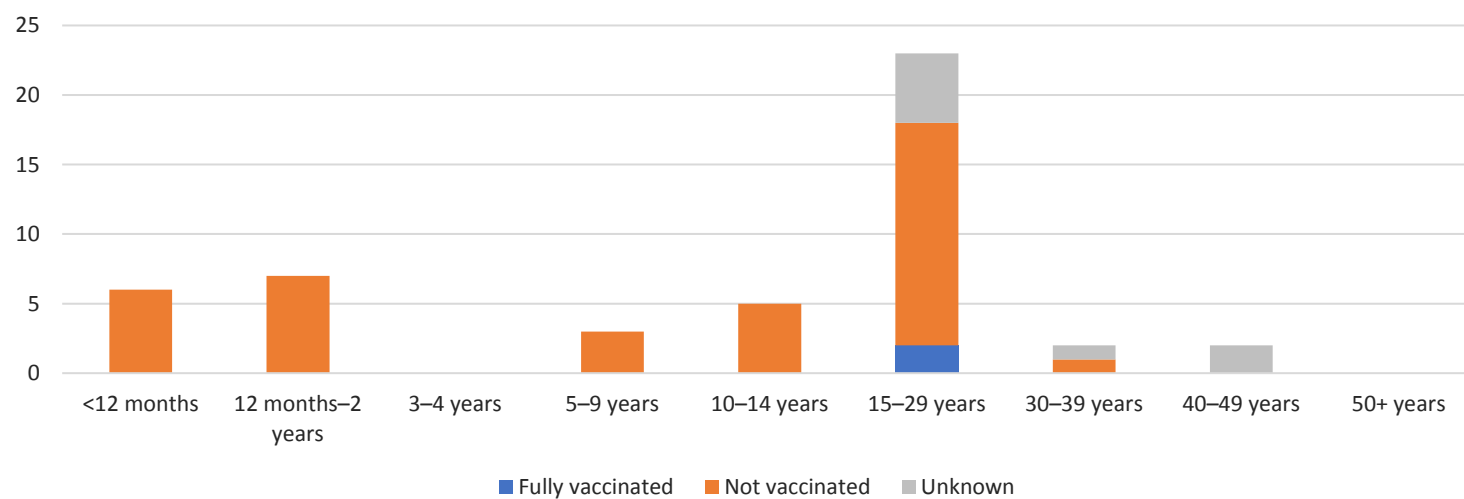
Outbreak Response

- Case management and contact tracing ongoing
- The priority remains to maintain the scheduled vaccinations a 15 months and 4 years.
- Prioritising immunisation for 229 Māori and Pacific children overdue for 15 month vaccination and 171 Māori and Pacific children overdue for 4 year old vaccination event has been submitted into the plan.

Vaccine Updates:

- 13,261 vaccines have been administered to date in 2019.
- The DHB has 1900 doses in stock as of 27 September 2019.
- The DHB requires 400 doses for overdue immunisations, and 2700 doses are required to maintain schedule.
- The Ministry has allocated 7350 doses from the 100,000 that are arriving 14 October 2019.
