



## **Need to know**

- As at 0900 hours there are nine additional cases since 0900 16 August 2020 (four additional since the 1800 16 August 2020 sit rep) and 58 community cases in total as set out in the table below. This total comprises 56 cases linked to the cluster *Auckland Community Cluster August 2020*.
  - Two of the 58 cases are still under investigation. The samples from the and the MIF worker will be sequenced today with a report expected from ESR at 1800.
- Of the four new confirmed cases reported since 1800 16 August:
  - o Two confirmed cases s 9(2)(a) are household contacts of confirmed cases
  - Two confirmed case are still being scoped, but are believed to be linked to the cluster.



  - Source attribution a focus on investigating the case with the earliest symptom onset date to gather details actions of movements 14 days prior. This will help to understand the possible source of the new outbreak.
  - Containment rigorous case investigation, identification of close contacts and isolation and testing to ensure that chain of transmission is broken.

### **Investigation: Auckland Community Cluster August 2020**

### Auckland case investigation updates

Americold (two sites with confirmed cases)

• The environmental swabbing at the Mt Wellington Americold site has been done. The swabs are being processed by ESR. Results for some of the swabs have returned weak positives for the virus. The site was re-sampled yesterday along with the Wiri site. The samples have been delivered to ESR for processing today and results will be available within the next 24 hours. A report on the initial Mt Wellington site visit and sampling will be available at the end of today.



 Six new close contacts at the Mt Wellington site were identified yesterday afternoon. All six have been tested yesterday and results are pending.

- Yesterday the CEO of Americold supplied a list of 110 contractors from 58 organisations that visited the Mt Wellington site in the last 14 days. This list is being scoped for close contacts.
- All of the 41 staff at the Mt Wellington Americold site have been tested. Nine are
  positive, 23 are negative and the remainder are pending. We will be prioritising the
  processing these swabs and seeking results today.

#### Finance Now

- 153 of 158 staff at Finance Now have been tested. Five are positive, 143 are negative, and five results are pending. We are following these up this morning.
- 28 of 31 Finance Now family close contacts have been tested. All 28 are negative. We are following up on the remaining three this morning.

#### NZ Post Distribution Centre

- A NZ Post distribution centre is associated with the cluster. An existing case reported on 16 August 2020 is an employee at the distribution centre and worked there while infectious.
- The site is being scoped and 23 workers have been identified as close contacts. We are following up on the status of this investigation this morning. The remaining workers at the site will be treated as casual contacts.

#### Other Locations

- A church in Auckland associated with a case at Mt Wellington workplace is being scoped. s 9(2)(a)

  Several hundred possible contacts have been identified through visitor logs. This is being followed up.
- Two additional churches in Auckland associated with cases are being scoped.
- There are seven educational institutions with associated with confirmed cases and six educational institutions associated with contacts of confirmed or probable cases.

### Waikato case investigation updates

- The two cases from Waikato are isolating at the Jet Park MIQ facility in Auckland.
- One of the cases attends a local polytechnic which has been closed and has undergone a deep clean. Two exposure events at the polytechnic have been scoped as follows:

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o Investigation of case's visit to s 9(2)(a) has been closed as no close contacts observed.

### **Updates from ESR and wider testing**

- Genome sequencing results the first four cases have been completed and are all consistent with each other. No identical match to any cases in the managed isolation and quarantine samples sequenced has been found. No identical match to any previous cases in New Zealand. Further investigation is ongoing.
- There is a one mutation difference between these samples and the closest genome identified globally to date (reported in May 2020). This very low mutation rate may indicate that the virus has not replicated many times. This may indicate that the virus has transmitted through a small number of people over this time, that this lineage mutates less, or that the virus has been transmitted through means other than personto-person spread, acknowledging that this requires a degree of environmental persistence that has yet been unobserved.

## **Contact Tracing**

• 1035 (78.5%) close contacts of 1318 confirmed cases reported from 8 August to 14 August have been successfully contacted within 48 hours. Since 11 August 1632 close contacts have been identified. Of these 1,461 of these have been contacted and are self-isolating. The remaining are in the process of being contacted.

## **Lab Testing numbers**

- Testing throughput the last 3 days to 15 August has been 23,846, 23,682, and 26,014 yesterday. A total of 73,542 over the last 3 days. These volumes have been made possible through pooling of samples and hard work of the labs to process.
- Swab supply is good with a further 60,000 swabs being put into circulation today

## **Testing activity by region**

#### **Focus areas:**

- There are 39 designated community testing centres in the wider Auckland region.

  Locations have been identified in partnership with the DHB's Pacific Team. Mobile testing sites are being redeployed to test close contacts as required. A few additional sites are also being scoped for community testing to open early next week.
- As at 1100 hours today there are now 20 testing sites in Auckland City. This includes
  two sites at Mt Wellington and Blockhouse Bay which are exclusively for close contact
  testing. Three new community testing centres are in plans to be set up.

•

Port and airport workers are continuing to be tested today. Overnight testing was done
at the Auckland airport to catch the night workers. The port and operators have been
very cooperative, and 2,556 tests have been done at the Auckland port to date.

## **Healthline updates**

- On 16 August there were 4,795 contacts in total through Healthline. Of those calls 2,542 were to the COVID-19 information line.
- On Friday 14 August the demand on 1737 Need to talk? and other mental health services was 9.2% higher than forecast with 640 contacts in total.
- On 16 August the average wait time on the COVID-19 Information Line was 08:59 minutes. This is a decrease in average wait time from 11:43 on 15 August continuing to decrease from 13:58 minutes on 14 August 2020.
- The main themes yesterday / today:
  - o People complaining that they have not had test results back yet
  - o People are starting to delay access to non-covid related care in Auckland
  - o False media / social media reporting of exposure events is causing unnecessary alarm and concern
  - People wanting information on how to get out of Auckland for compassionate reasons and get exemptions
  - The theme of charging people for tests diminished yesterday
  - Increase in Mental health service lines anxiety relating to going back into lockdown rather than covid related anxiety

## **Health Workforce**

- Health Workforce are working with DHBs to investigate the feasibility of establishing a micro-credential for swabbing to expand capacity. It is envisaged the Kaiāwhina workforce will be used.
- Health Workforce is continuing to work with all 20 DHBs to understand their workforce needs, identify any gaps and provide support where possible.
- Health Workforce provided advice to NRHCC on workforce implications for the airside testing order at Auckland Airport.

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



### **Lab Testing numbers**

- On 16 August 2020 26,014 tests were completed nationally; bringing the total number of tests to 95,251 since (and including) 12 August 2020.
- Testing throughput the last 3 days to 15 August has been 23,846, 23,682, and 26,014 yesterday. A total of 73,542 over the last 3 days. These volumes have been made possible through pooling of samples and hard work of the labs to process.

### **Testing activity by region**

### Focus areas:

- There are 39 designated community testing centres in the wider Auckland region. Locations have been identified in partnership with the DHB's Pacific Team. Mobile testing sites are being redeployed to test close contacts as required. A few additional sites are also being scoped for community testing to open early next week.
- As at 1100 hours today there are now 20 testing sites in Auckland City. This includes two sites at Mt Wellington and Blockhouse Bay which are exclusively for close contact testing. Three new community testing centres are in plans to be set up.
- Port and airport workers are continuing to be tested today. Overnight testing was done
  at the Auckland airport to catch the night workers. The port and operators have been
  very cooperative, and 2,556 tests have been done at the Auckland port to date.

## **Healthline updates**

- On 16 August there were 4,795 contacts in total through Healthline. Of those calls 2,542 were to the COVID-19 information line.
- On Friday 14 August the demand on 1737 Need to talk? and other mental health services was 9.2% higher than forecast with 640 contacts in total.
- On 16 August the average wait time on the COVID-19 Information Line was 08:59 minutes. This is a decrease in average wait time from 11:43 on 15 August continuing to decrease from 13:58 minutes the day before.
- The main themes yesterday / today:
  - o People complaining that they have not had test results back yet.
  - People are starting to delay access to non-COVID-19 related care in Auckland.
  - o False media / social media reporting of exposure events is causing unnecessary alarm and concern.
  - People wanting information on how to get out of Auckland for compassionate reasons and get exemptions.
  - o The theme of charging people for tests diminished yesterday.
  - Increase in Mental health service lines anxiety relating to going back into lockdown rather than COVID-19 related anxiety.

## **Logistics**

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- Health Workforce are working closely with ARPHS around a request for public health clinicians to support the response in Auckland, as well as workforce support for contact tracing.
- Health Workforce are working with DHBs to investigate the feasibility of establishing a
  micro-credential for swabbing to expand capacity. It is envisaged the Kaiāwhina
  workforce will be used.
- Health Workforce is continuing to work with all 20 DHBs to understand their workforce needs, identify any gaps and provide support where possible.

### **Health Supply**

- 30,000 swabs are expected to be distributed today with a further 30,000 tomorrow.
- It is expected that 100,000 swabs will arrive by the end of the week.





#### Finance Now



  Several hundred possible contacts have been identified through visitor logs. This is being followed up.
- Two additional churches in Auckland associated with cases are being scoped.

## **Updates from ESR and wider testing**

- Genome sequencing results the first four cases have been completed and are all consistent with each other. - There is a one mutation difference between these samples and the closest genome identified globally to date (reported in May 2020). This very low mutation rate may indicate that the virus has not replicated many times. This may indicate that the virus

has transmitted through a small number of people over this time, that this lineage mutates less, or that the virus has been transmitted through means other than person-to-person spread, acknowledging that this requires a degree of environmental persistence that has yet been unobserved.







#### Other Locations

- A church in Auckland associated with a case at Mt Wellington workplace is being scoped. § 9(2)(a)

  Several hundred possible contacts have been identified through visitor logs. This is being followed up.
- Two additional churches in Auckland associated with cases are being scoped.
- All staff and residents at the Rydges Hotel in Auckland are going to be retested. This is due to the inability to establish at link to the maintenance worker. All solution household contacts of the maintenance worker have tested negative, all solution work close contacts have been ordered for testing. We will report on the results of the testing as it is reported. A possible link to a confirmed case (guest) has been re-interviewed and no connection is evident.

#### Waikato case investigation updates

- The two cases from Waikato are isolating at the Jet Park MIQ facility in Auckland.
- Two sites have been investigated. Throughout the investigation of the educational institution and associated households all 24 close contacts have been tested and returned negative results. These individuals are still in self isolation, awaiting day 12 testing. All 117 casual contacts have tested negative.

### **Updates from ESR and wider testing**

- Environmental sampling and testing has been completed for COVID-19 at the Mount Wellington and Wiri Americold sites by ESR.
- SARS-CoV-2 was detected at very low levels in gauze swabs take from the Mount
  Wellington site in areas that were likely to be touch zones for Americold employees
  who have tested positive for COVID-19.
- Detected levels were too low to allow sequencing of the virus, so genomic analysis and comparison to the genomes of cases that worked at Americold was not possible. No SARS-CoV-2 was detected on any internal packaging sampled. No SARS-CoV-2 was detected at the Wiri site.

- We are working with TAS and all 20 GMsHR on workforce needs and issues an initial data exercise was undertaken last week and we are developing a process whereby regular workforce intelligence information will be provided to Health Workforce, which in turn will be developed in to a regular dashboard. We expect this process to be agreed and in place later this week

### **Increasing Testing Capacity**

30,000 swabs are being distributed around the country today. A further 20,000 per day
will be available over the next two days. 50,000 swabs arrive Wednesday and 100,000

People wanting information on how to get out of Auckland for compassionate reasons and get exemptions. Increase in Mental health service lines anxiety relating to going back into lockdown rather than COVID related anxiety





## **Health system response**

## **Overall approach**

- Our investigation has two main focus areas that run in parallel:
  - Source attribution a focus on investigating the case with the earliest symptom onset date to gather details actions of movements 14 days prior. This will help to understand the possible source of the new outbreak.
  - o **Containment** rigorous case investigation, identification of close contacts and isolation and testing to ensure that chain of transmission is broken.

## **Investigation: Auckland Community Cluster August 2020**

### Auckland case investigation updates

Americold (two sites with confirmed cases)

- Across the two Americold sites there has been a total of 76 people tested. Of these, 10 are positive, 66 are negative.
- The remaining community case under investigation is from Auckland. The case works in a retail store in St Lukes Mall. The case tested positive for COVID-19 on 18 August 2020, and has been in isolation since then. There is no known link to the current community outbreak. Genomic sequencing is being undertaken to establish whether [10] is linked

to the outbreak. We expect the results of this investigation to be available tomorrow (21 August).

 The contractor list is being reconciled with the previously identified close contacts and remains under investigation. Education for businesses around COVID-19 reporting is required to ensure rapid contact tracing.

#### Finance Now

- 158 of 158 staff at Finance Now have been tested. Five are positive, 147 are negative, and six results are pending.
- 31 of 31 Finance Now family close contacts have all tested negative. 1

#### NZ Post Distribution Centre

- Four NZ Post close contacts have tested negative. 190 possible contacts (not defined as close or casual) were tested 19 August.
- A NZ Post distribution centre is associated with the cluster. An existing case reported on 16 August 2020 is an employee at the distribution centre and worked there while infectious.

#### Other Locations

- Several hundred possible contacts from an Auckland churches have been identified, details below:
  - o Church one: 51 of the 88 close contacts have been tested, results pending.
  - Church two: 69 of the 81 contacts (close/casual to be determined) have recorded a test, results pending.
  - Church three: A list of congregational members could not be provided at this time, however on-site testing has been offered. More information is being sought, and will be provided as it becomes available.
  - o Church four: 50 of the 54 contacts (close/casual to be determined) have recorded a test, results pending.
  - o Church five: members of the church have been identified as casual contacts and are not required to be tested, but members have been offered testing.
- All staff and residents at the Rydges Hotel in Auckland are going to be retested. This is due to the inability to establish at link to the maintenance worker. All work household contacts of the maintenance worker have tested negative, all work close contacts have been ordered for testing. We will report on the results of the testing as it is reported. A possible link to a confirmed case (guest) has been re-interviewed and no connection is evident.

## Waikato case investigation updates

• A close household contact of the two existing cases from Tokoroa tested positive for COVID-19 on August the 19th. has been in isolation at home since 12th August, the date when the two existing cases tested positive. § 9(2)(a)

The remaining household contact of the existing Tokoroa cases is isolating at home and has returned two negative results.<sup>2</sup>

## **Updates from ESR and wider testing**

- Environmental sampling and testing has been completed for COVID-19 at the Mount Wellington and Wiri Americold sites by ESR.
- SARS-CoV-2 was detected at very low levels in gauze swabs take from the Mount
  Wellington site in areas that were likely to be touch zones for Americold employees
  who have tested positive for COVID-19.
- Detected levels were too low to allow sequencing of the virus, so genomic analysis and comparison to the genomes of cases that worked at Americold was not possible. No SARS-CoV-2 was detected on any internal packaging sampled. No SARS-CoV-2 was detected at the Wiri site.

# **Contact Tracing**

- Over the period 11 17 August 79.3% (1,263 of 1,292) of close contacts have been contacted within 48 hrs of being determined to be a contact.<sup>3</sup>
- Since the 11 August, 1,996 close contacts have been identified and recorded in the National Contact Tracing Solution, 1,921 of these have been contacted and are selfisolating, and we are in the process of contacting the rest.

## Testing activity by region

#### Focus areas:

- There are 20 testing sites in Auckland City. The volumes of tests have averaged 5,100 tests for the last six days.
- Added testing activity has been developed in the regions, with an additional 19
  designated community centres established outside of the Auckland city. These facilities
  have been collecting approximately 4,300 swabs each day.
- The 20 testing sites in Auckland city together with the 19 designated community centres outside of the city make the 39 designated community centres in the wider Auckland region.

# **Healthline updates**

- On 19 August we had 4,221 contacts in Healthline (compared to 1,036 on the same day last year). Of those calls, 2,519 were to the Covid Info line. On 19 August demand on 1737 Need to talk? and other mental health services was 718 contacts (22.5% higher than forecast and compared to 452 on the same day last year).
- Wait times were well managed with no wait time for most of the day. We had a couple of surges through media identifying new places of interest which saw the wait time creep out to circa 15 minutes at one point in time. Average wait time on On 19 August for the COVID info line was 02:06 minutes.
- The introduction of self-service text and digital channels on our IVR systems saw 202 people self-serve yesterday. More than half the people were wanting information on Auckland testing sites.<sup>5</sup>
- The main themes yesterday / today:

- People are delaying access to care for non-covid related symptoms. We also continued to have reports that people are afraid to enter the Auckland hospitals – key messages that reinforce that COVID patients in hospital are isolated rather "than on wards" could help reduce this.
- o On 19 August we continued to see the new trend around racism in the public (earlier in this event we saw racism directed to the pacific community and south Auckland residents) yesterday we took a number of calls where anger and racist remarks were made relating to the Chinese community for being the origin of the virus.
- Many people called about not getting any response to their application on exemptions who are providing essential services or have compassionate reasons, some of them waited for more than 5 days.
- o People in self isolation calling to confirm their obligations.
- People complaining that they have not had test results back yet.
- People struggling with the requirement by some airline/countries on receiving a negative test result before flight because now it takes longer than 96 hours to have the result back.
- o False media / social media reporting of exposure events is causing unnecessary alarm and concern

## **Logistics**

#### **Health Workforce**

- Upskilling of alternative workforces for testing continues to be progressed including
  plans for a training package (testing) and scoping of micro-credentialing, in addition to
  understanding where this workforce would be obtained from.
- We have provided names of public health clinicians on the surge database to ARPHS.
   We will continue to provide support to the requests received. One public health doctor has offered support to ARPHS.
- We are working with TAS and all 20 GMsHR on workforce needs and issues.



## **Updates from ESR and wider testing**

- Environmental sampling and testing has been completed for COVID-19 at the Mount Wellington and Wiri Americold sites by ESR.
- SARS-CoV-2 was detected at very low levels in gauze swabs take from the Mount Wellington site in areas that were likely to be touch zones for Americold employees who have tested positive for COVID-19.



- 1. As at 0900 23 August there are 96 current community cases in total as set out in the table below. This total comprises 93 cases linked to the cluster *August 2020*. Three cases are not currently genomically or epidemiologically linked. Ongoing investigations are occurring to determine links, see detail below in (4).
- 2. As at 0900 23 August there are three additional cases since 0900 22 August 2020, one in the community and two detected from border testing.
- 3. The one new confirmed community case reported since 0900 22 August is linked to the current cluster with epidemiological links with other confirmed cases.

- 4. There are three existing cases with no epidemiological link to date:
  - One case came through the border on 18 June 2020 and was transferred to a quarantine facility at that time. The case tested negative at day three and day twelve of quarantine. The case was swabbed at a mobile testing clinic in Auckland as the \$9(2)(a) around the same period as an international confirmed case \$9(2)(a) around the case tested positive on August 21. \$9(2)(a) Samples from this case are being couriered to ESR today (23 August) for urgent sequencing tomorrow (24 August).

## **Health system response**

#### **Overall approach**

- 8. Our investigation has two main focus areas that run in parallel:
  - Source attribution a focus on investigating the case with the earliest symptom onset date to gather details actions of movements 14 days prior. This will help to understand the possible source of the new outbreak.

 Containment – rigorous case investigation, identification of close contacts and isolation and testing to ensure that chain of transmission is broken.

#### **Investigation: Auckland Community Cluster August 2020**

#### Auckland case investigation updates

Americold (two sites with confirmed cases)

- 9. Across the two Americold sites there has been a total of 76 people tested. Of these, 10 are positive, 66 are negative.
- 10. The contractor list is being reconciled with the previously identified close contacts and remains under investigation. Education for businesses around COVID-19 reporting is required to ensure rapid contact tracing. So far 3 identified contractors have been tested and have returned negative results.
- 11. 12 day testing of Mt Wellington Americold workers has been offered by a mobile team and staff aware they cannot return to work without a negative test.

#### Finance Now

- 12. 206 of 216 s 9(2)(a) contacts at Finance Now have been tested. Seven are positive s 9(2)(a) 199 are negative. No pending results remain. We will provide additional details about the outstanding 10 people as they become available.
- 13. 31 of 31 Finance Now family close contacts have all tested negative. <sup>1</sup>

#### NZ Post Distribution Centre

- 14. A NZ Post distribution centre is associated with the cluster. An existing case reported on 16 August 2020 is an employee at the distribution centre and worked there while infectious. The PHU in collaboration with the employer has reclassified the entire shift that the case worked on as close contacts. This shift includes approximately 70 people have been stood down and asked to self-isolate at home. These people will be retested on day 12.
- 15. Four NZ Post close contacts have tested negative. Over 200 possible contacts (not defined as close or casual) were tested 19 August. We will be following up on these results. Approximately 30% have been tested, of these all are negative.

#### Other Locations

- 16. A new setting is being scoped. This is the workplace of a case identified yesterday. So far eight contacts have been identified and are being followed up.
- 17. As at 21 August there were a total of 260 close contacts identified at the five churches linked to the cluster. Details below:

- 35. Swab deliveries are expected early this week of 100,000, and a further 200,000 by the end of the week.

#### **Testing activity by region**

#### Focus areas:

- 36. The 20 testing sites in Auckland city together with the 19 designated community centres outside of the city make the 39 designated community centres in the wider Auckland region.
- 37. Day 12 testing for three Auckland churches and Americold warehouse staff and wider site is continuing this weekend with dedicated close contact community testing centres.

## **Healthline updates**

- 38. On 22 August we had 3,121 contacts in Healthline (compared to 991 on the same day last year). Of those calls, 1,069 were to the Covid Info line. On 22 August demand on 1737 Need to talk? and other mental health services was 583 contacts (0.5% lower than forecast and compared to 550 on the same day last year).
- 39. Wait times were well managed with no wait time for most of the day. Average wait time on 22 August for the COVID info line was 01:49 minutes.
- 40. The introduction of self-service text and digital channels on our IVR systems saw 62 people self-serve yesterday. More than half the people were wanting information on Auckland testing sites .<sup>4</sup>

The main themes yesterday / today:

- Yesterday we had a number of calls from elderly service users who live alone needing both medical advice (some who had delayed) and general advice on the rules around level 3 – i.e. can I go out at all.
- Yesterday for both frontline and self-service channels there was a sharp increase in people wanting general information about the virus; for example what it is, and how it infects people.

- o Symptomatic SU's wanting to be tested.
- o Yesterday continued to see racist views expressed to Healthline staff.
- Many people called about not getting any response to their application on exemptions who are providing essential services or have compassionate reasons.
- o People are also complaining that they have not had test results back yet.

## **Logistics**

#### **Health Workforce**

- 41. We continue to work with TAS and all 20 GMsHR on workforce needs and issues an initial data exercise was undertaken last week and we are developing a process whereby regular workforce intelligence information will be provided to Health Workforce, which in turn will be developed in to a regular dashboard. We expect this process to be agreed and in place at the end of this week.
- 42. Upskilling of alternative workforces for testing continues to be progressed including plans for a training package and scoping of micro-credentialing, in addition to understanding where this workforce would be obtained from.
- 43. We are working to identify people on the surge workforce who would be willing to work in an ARC facility in the event of an outbreak. We will also be meeting with ARC stakeholders next week to understand what additional workforce planning support can be undertaken and any lessons learnt from the recent events in ARC facilities in Melbourne (as they relate to workforce).


