Thank you for your follow up request under the Official Information Act 1982 (the Act) to the Ministry of Health (the Ministry) on 2 December 2021 for information relating to alcohol and drug (AOD) treatment funding. Please find a response to each part of your request below.

Please could I now request the MOH and DHB expenditure for AOD treatment services from 2020/21, which I believe is available from this month?"

The table below lists the AOD treatment expenditure for 2020 and 2021, broken down by DHB.

On page twelve of the response (attached), you set out total funding between July 2019 and Sept 30 2021. Please could you confirm if this is just the amount allocated from Budget 2019? Will this amount also have been added into your calculation of total spending on AOD treatment which I understand to be as follows?

Document Seven only includes funding spent between 1 July 2019 and 30 September 2021 on initiatives funded through Budget 2019. These initiatives include:

- Enhancing Primary addiction responses
- Enhancing the quality and capacity of specialist AOD services
- Te Ara Oranga
- Intensive parenting support

This spending has also been included within calculation of the total spend on AOD treatment.”

On page one of the response you set out figures for waiting times. I am confused as to why only a small number of people are listed in this table compared to the 47K who accessed treatment – are wait times not calculated for them?

The wait times data is sourced from the MH03 wait times report, which is an established DHB measure for monitoring new client referral wait times. The wait times collected are only for new clients. “New” clients are defined as persons who have not accessed mental health and addiction services in the past year.

PRIMHD is a Ministry of Health national mental health and addiction information collection of service activity and outcomes data for health consumers. PRIMHD collects data from about 85 organisations providing AOD specialist secondary services – 16 DHBs and 69 NGOs. However, data for some organisations is incomplete in PRIMHD and there may be some other mental health services that also support people with substance issues.

3) PRIMHD is living data collection, which continues to be revised and updated as data reporting processes are improved. For this reason, previously published data may be liable to amendments.
