Purpose of meeting/ proposal:

This paper provides Cabinet with further information on the current financial performance of Health NZ and associated risks for the 2024/25 year, and sets out the proposed actions to address these.

Comment:

- In June 2024 you appointed Dr Lester Levy as the new Chair of Health NZ. Dr Levy is beginning to develop a turn-around plan to address Health NZ's deteriorating financial position.
- On 1 July 2024 you raised Health NZ's financial situation with Cabinet and indicated a paper to Cabinet would follow.
- This paper provides further background to the current financial issues and outlines the key elements of Dr Levy's proposed turnaround plan.
- It also outlines your intention to further strengthen governance of Health NZ and asks for Cabinet's agreement to commence a process that may end with the removal of the Board and appointment of a commissioner for 12 months.
- The Treasury, the Department of Prime Minister and Cabinet and Dr Lester Levy have been consulted on this paper.
- This Cabinet paper was lodged by 10.00am on 4 July 2024.
