# PROPOSED OVERSEAS TRAVEL: WORLD HEALTH ASSEMBLY, FRIDAY 20 MAY 2022 – FRIDAY 27 MAY 2022 INCLUSIVE

### Proposal

- 1. I seek Cabinet's approval to travel in my capacity as Minister of Health to Switzerland to attend the World Health Assembly, and to the United Kingdom to meet with global experts in health locality planning, from Friday 20 May 2022 to Friday 27 May 2022 travel inclusive.
- 2. Approval in-principle to travel has been granted by the Prime Minister.

### Purpose of travel

- 3. The World Health Assembly is the decision-making body of World Health Organisation (WHO). It is attended by delegations from all WHO Member States and focuses on a specific health agenda prepared by the Executive Board. The main functions of the World Health Assembly are to determine the policies of the Organization, appoint the Director-General, supervise financial policies, and review and approve the proposed programme budget.
- 4. Ministry of Health officials have recommended I attend this year's World Health Assembly in Geneva, Switzerland, to deliver New Zealand's national address and attend bilateral meetings with other Health Ministers. This will be the first significant in-person meeting of Health Ministers since the start of the COVID-19 pandemic.
- 5. It is anticipated that New Zealand's national address will be delivered local Geneva time on any of Sunday 22 May 2022, Monday 23 May 2022 or Tuesday 24 May 2022. The remainder of the time in Geneva would be used for bilateral meetings.
- Additionally I would travel for one day to Dudley, United Kingdom, to meet with global experts in health locality planning. Improved locality planning is an important objective of the government's health and disability reform agenda.

- 8. Ministry of Health officials would support me at departmental expense.
