# Request for official information

Thank you for your request of 18 June 2019 to the Ministry of Health (the Ministry) under the Official Information Act 1982 (the Act) for information regarding payments by the Ministry to cause interest groups, economic interest groups, consumer interest groups, industry/sector unions, and any publications of media outlets. I trust this information fulfils your request.


