Request for official information

Thank you for your request of 23 July 2019 to the Ministry of Health (the Ministry) under the Official Information Act 1982 (the Act):

"Today the Minister's office sent out a press release about 5 workshops being held with mental health and addiction leaders.

Under the OIA I would like to request the details of these workshops and the cost."

We have interpreted the part of your request regarding 'details' to mean the number of attendees, the workshop agenda and presentation document.

A total of 389 people, (including Ministry staff) attended the five workshops on the Expanding Access and Choice Initiative. The Minister of Health, Hon Dr David Clark, attended all of these workshops.

Please find the agenda for the workshops attached to this letter. This is released to you in full.

Your request for the presentation document is refused in full under section 18(d) of the Act, as this information is publicly available: https://www.health.govt.nz/our-work/mental-health-and-addiction-directorate. Please note, the presentations are in the right hand side bar under the 'Downloads' heading.

The final cost of the workshops is not known as invoices have not yet been received. For this reason, your request for the cost of the workshops is refused in full under section 18(g) of the Act, as the information is not held by the Ministry and I have no reason to believe that it is held by another agency, Minister, or any organisation subject to the Act.

I trust this information fulfils your request. Under section 28 of the Act, you have the right to ask the Ombudsman to review any decisions in this response.
