## Response to your request for official information

Thank you for your request under the Official Information Act 1982 (the Act) received by Manatū Hauora (the Ministry of Health), the Department of the Prime Minister and Cabinet (DPMC) and the Ministry of Business Innovation and Employment (MBIE) on 28 September 2022 regarding multidrug-resistant tuberculosis and human immunodeficiency virus (HIV). You requested:

"Given the risk to public health should multidrug-resistant tuberculosis be introduced to New Zealand and a higher risk of developing HIV, please provide the following information:

- (a) What health screening and tests will the Ukraine immigrants be required to undertake prior to arriving in New Zealand?
- (b) What health screening and tests will the Ukraine immigrants be required to undertake on arrival in New Zealand?
- (c) Will the health screening and tests be mandatory or voluntary?
- (d) Will the immigrant be able to refuse any health screen, health screens, test and/or tests?
- (e) What information is being given to public health authorities and doctors about the risk of multidrug-resistant tuberculosis and HIV in the Ukrainian population? What information is being given to public health authorities and doctors about the risk of multidrug-resistant tuberculosis and HIV in the Ukrainian population?
- (f) What information is being given to the public about the risk of multidrug-resistant tuberculosis and HIV?
- (g) Will the detection of multidrug-resistant tuberculosis and/or HIV in potential immigrants provide sufficient grounds for the refusal of entry into New Zealand?
- (h) How many immigrants are allowed to enter New Zealand on a Special Visa?
- (i) Please provide a copy of the risk assessment undertaken by the Government in regards to the risk of multidrug-resistant tuberculosis and HIV in regards to the Special Visa.

- (c) Will the health screening and tests be mandatory or voluntary?
- (j) Please provide us with the estimated cost to the New Zealand taxpayer for the Special Visa scheme?
- (k) Please provide a copy of all documents that shows how the Government has prepared for an increase in hostility between New Zealand Russian and Ukrainian communities."

Parts a, b, c d, g, h, i, j and k are more closely connected to the functions of Immigration New Zealand. However, given your request was also received by MBIE, a formal transfer is not necessary.

Regarding parts e and f of your request, Manatū Hauora is providing you with a table summarising our communications and engagement regarding multidrug- resistant tuberculosis and HIV.
