Response to your request for official information

Thank you for your request under the Official Information Act 1982 (the Act) to Manatū Hauora (the Ministry of Health) on 26 October 2022 for information regarding health practitioners. You requested:

"Any and all policies/documents providing guidance on the ability of health practitioners with bloodborne diseases to practice, that includes the words 'hepatitis', 'hep B', and/or 'hepatitis B"

There are no documents on the ability of health practitioners with bloodborne diseases to practice. As such, your request is refused under section 18(e) of the Act as the information requested does not exist.
