NATIONAL MEASLES OUTBREAK 2019

Issued: 1500 hrs, 16 SEPTEMBER 2019

National Situation

- From 1 January 2019 to 16 September 2019 (as at 0830hrs) there have been 1277
 confirmed cases of measles notified across New Zealand, based on ESR reporting. This
 is an increase of 11 cases nationally since Exception Report 04 provided on Saturday 14
 September.
- Over the last two weeks (2 September to 16 September) 295 more cases have been reported nationally. During this period, reported case numbers have continued to increase rapidly in the Auckland region (248 new cases), with most cases reported in Counties Manukau District Health Board (CMDHB) (170 cases). See Appendix 1 for details.
- 3. Given the large number of cases in the Auckland region, it is expected that further isolated cases will continue to be reported in areas outside of the Auckland region.
- 4. Recent cases outside of the Auckland region have been linked to the Auckland outbreak, and are limited to single cases and small clusters, such as the Queenstown outbreak. Public health units (outside of the Auckland region) continue to manage these cases and their contacts promptly, in order to limit transmission.
- 5. As expected, most cases have been in unvaccinated people, or in those whose vaccination status is unknown. There have been no reported deaths associated with this outbreak.

Auckland Situation

- 7. The ongoing significant measles outbreak in the Auckland region commenced in March 2019. As at 0830hrs 16 September, there have been 1064 confirmed cases of measles in this region, which is an increase of 36 cases in the Auckland region since Situation Report 11 provided on Friday 13 September.
- 8. New cases are mainly occurring in South Auckland. In total **736** cases have occurred in CMDHB (see *Appendix 1* for details). In South Auckland, the cases have been mainly in the 0–4 and 20–29-year age groups and predominantly in the Pacific population.

Auckland Region Response - Key Actions

Auckland Regional Public Health Service (ARPHS)

The Auckland region continues to implement outbreak control strategies, including:

- 9. Working to increase the population immunity against measles, particularly in young children (lowering the age of the first MMR vaccine to 12 months from 15 months and active recall of children who have not been vaccinated), Pacific people, and those aged between 15 and 29 years.
- 10. Raising awareness of the current situation, including public messaging on the outbreak.
- 11. Working with local organisations, including schools, the Mangere Refugee Resettlement Centre, and organisers of major events, to provide advice and information on measles.
- 12. A letter to school principals with a link to a new School Pack has been sent. ARPHS is also proactively following up with schools who have children with confirmed measles to ensure they have the most up to date information.

Counties Manukau DHB

- 13. As at 13 September, 303 cases have been admitted to Middlemore Hospital since June 2019. This currently includes seven children with measles, admitted to a paediatric isolation ward, and one adult in-patient at Middlemore Hospital.
- 14. The final day for opportunistic vaccinations in ED was Saturday, 14 September.
- 15. The final day for Middlemore Hospital drop-in clinic is Thursday 19 September.
- 16. Community drop-in clinics continue, including clinics in Manurewa High on Friday 13 September, and Papakura High on 14 and 15 September.
- 17. Up to 15 September, 5,112 additional vaccinations have been given through the outreach clinics in Counties Manukau. Of these, 15.1% have been given to those identifying as Māori, and 23.6% to those identifying as Pacific.
- 18. A school-based vaccination programme is scheduled to commence on Monday 16 September. As at 1130 hrs there are no further details.

Other Regions' Response - Key Actions

Southern DHB

- 19. As at 13 September 2019, there have been **21** confirmed cases of measles in Southern DHB. 17 of these cases have occurred in the last two weeks *(see Appendix 1)*.
- 20. Southern DHB has implemented outbreak management strategies, including:
 - Active contact tracing and isolation.
 - Raising awareness through public messaging.
 - Managing the vaccine stock.
 - Southern DHB is assessing the risk of spread into other areas, such as Wanaka, Arrowtown, and Dunedin.
- 21. Southern DHB continues to provide situation reports to the National Health Coordination Centre (NHCC) on a regular basis.

Ministry of Health

- 22. Daily teleconferences continue to be held between the three Auckland DHBs and the NHCC.
- 23. The Ministry of Health continues to work closely with public health units (PHUs) with cases of measles across the country.
- 24. The expert advisory group met for the second time on 10 September 2019 to provide further advice on the situation. Recommendations from the advisory group are being finalised and will inform the Ministry's advice to Government.
- 25. The Ministry of Health is working to ensure the NHCC is well staffed for the next few weeks to support the ongoing regional response.

Vaccine Stock and Distribution

- 26. Ongoing routine immunisation programmes and high community immunity are the best way to prevent disease outbreaks. However, vaccination is not typically the first response for an outbreak of measles as it takes 14 days to develop immunity following vaccination.
- 27. The Ministry of Health is in contact with DHB Planning and Funding Managers across New Zealand to manage stock requirements.
- 28. PHARMAC has arranged with the vaccine supplier to bring forward the next two expected orders of vaccine to assist with supporting the increased demand of vaccine. An order of 52,000 doses of MMR vaccine arrived in New Zealand on 16 September, with orders expected to be able to be taken from 19 September.

Public Information Management / Media

- 29. Media interest continues for the Ministry of Health, PHARMAC and DHBs. Media responses should mirror the Ministry messaging for national consistency. All agencies continue to focus on exploring ways to proactively push vaccination messages and health awareness
- 30. A health sector update was sent on 11 September regarding protecting the most vulnerable populations. The Ministry of Health has provided guidance for general practices and primary health organisations (PHOs). The Ministry is working with DHBs to manage stock distribution and are asking general practices and PHOs to reserve vaccines for priority groups.

Phone lines

31. The National Telehealth Service (Healthline) continues to experience high call volumes on symptomatic calls, particularly on weekdays. Below is an update regarding activity for the 24-hour periods ended midnight on each day of the three day to 13 to 15 September.

- 32. The PlunketLine has also reported an increased number of calls since 30 August, particularly from the following regions: Waitemata, the Auckland region, especially Counties Manakau, Waikato, Bay of Plenty, Southern.
- 33. Tuesday 10 September, the PlunketLine at IMAC conducted a live Facebook chat on measles, with a total of 9700 views.

Figure 1. Cases of measles in New Zealand and the Auckland Region to 16 September 2019




Figure 2. Cases of measles per DHB in Auckland March 2019 to 16 September 2019




Figure 3. Number of confirmed cases by week and DHB for the last six months, 2019
