Results cover those patients who received their first cancer treatment between October 2014 and March 2015.

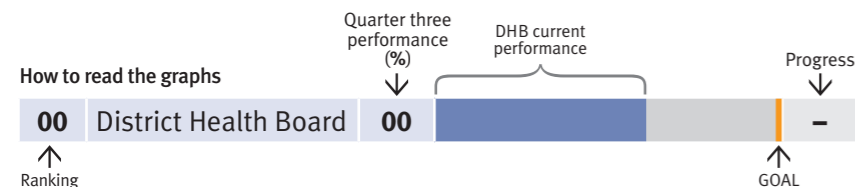
