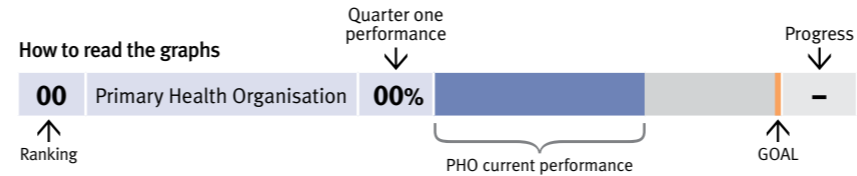

Increased immunisation

The national immunisation target is 90 percent of eight-month-olds will have their primary course of immunisation (six weeks, three months and five months immunisation events) on time by July 2014 and 95 percent by December 2014. This quarterly progress includes children who turned eight months between July and September 2013, are enrolled in a PHO and who were fully immunised at that stage. Consequently, the All PHOs percentage above (92%) will be different to the All DHBs percentage (91%).
