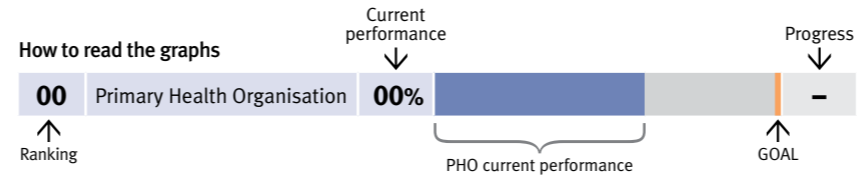

Increased immunisation

The national immunisation target is 95 percent of eight-month-olds will have their primary course of immunisation (six weeks, three months and five months immunisation events) on time by December 2014. This quarterly progress includes children who turned eight months between July and September 2014, are enrolled in a PHO and who were fully immunised at that stage. Consequently, the All PHOs percentage above will be different to the All DHBs percentage.

Better help for smokers to quit

The national target is that 90 percent of patients who smoke and are seen by a health practitioner in primary care are offered brief advice and support to quit smoking. *Ngati Porou Hauora Charitable Trust, Nga Mataapuna Oranga Limited, Manaia Health PHO Limited, Procure Networks Limited and Auckland PHO Limited are above 100 percent as in addition to offering advice in primary care settings they contacted patients who had not recently attended their general practice to offer them brief advice and support to quit smoking.
