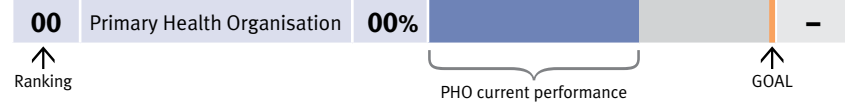

#### Increased immunisation

The national immunisation target is 95 percent of two year olds will be fully immunised by July 2012. From quarter one 2012/13, the national immunisation target will change to 85 percent of eight month olds have their primary course of immunisations on time by July 2013. There are some small differences between PHO Performance Programme (PPP) figures and those supplied by the Ministry of Health. PPP uses a total population value that includes children who have left NZ. Consequently the percentage reported above will be lower than the total DHB percentage, despite absolute numbers of immunisations being the same.

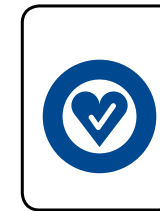

#### More heart and diabetes checks

This target is 90 percent of the eligible population will have had their cardiovascular risk assessed in the last five years to be achieved in stages by 1 July 2014. The first stage is to achieve 60 percent by July 2012, and 75 percent by July 2013.
